



Are you facing housing instability? RAFT may be able to help

Residential Assistance for Families in Transition (RAFT) can help pay for up to \$4,000 of eligible housing expenses for households with low to moderate income who:

- Have experienced a loss of income and cannot pay rent or mortgage
- Are behind on rent or mortgage
- Are behind on utility payments
- Are homeless or at risk and need financial assistance to be rehoused

...**and more**. You do not need a court summons to apply for RAFT during the eviction moratorium. RAFT covers a variety of situations. A housing case manager at one of the 11 RAFT administering nonprofit organizations is the best person to help you figure out if you are eligible for RAFT or any other housing programs.
